Definition

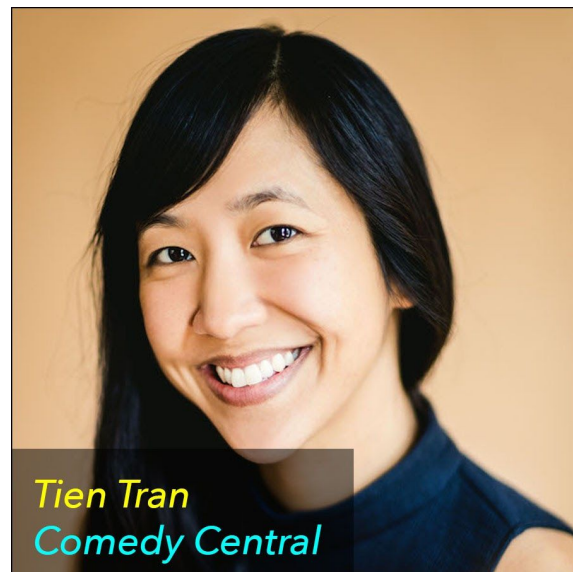
1. Asian American who is repressed emotionally and/or sexually, and then it comes out in weird, usually disastrous ways.
