Vietnamese Boat People *debuts* "Our Journeys" a storytelling exhibition at Think!Chinatown's Studio

Vietnamese Boat People (VBP) is proud to announce *Our Journeys: 50 Years After the Fall*, a multimedia storytelling exhibition opening September 7, 2025, at Think! Chinatown's Studio (1 Pike Street, NYC 10002). Featuring a powerful collection of oral histories, personal artifacts, and community-driven reflections, *Our Journeys* centers the voices of Vietnamese Americans and invites audiences to trace the emotional, historical, and cultural threads of migration across generations.

Since 2018, VBP has preserved the untold stories of the Vietnamese diaspora through its acclaimed podcast, community recordings, and grassroots storytelling initiatives. *Our Journeys* marks a culmination of these efforts, transforming oral histories into a deeply human and visual experience. From personal narratives to meaningful artifacts, the exhibition reveals how stories and objects carry the weight of memory, fostering intergenerational connection and healing.

Opening with a timeline, the exhibition shares stories reflecting the journeys of Vietnamese refugees right after the Fall of Saigon in 1975. It then features personal objects, media loops, and a global map where visitors can trace their own migration journeys. Conversation cards spark intergenerational dialogue and invite guests to add their stories to VBP's digital archives. At its core, the exhibition shows storytelling as both inheritance and offering—a bridge between past and future, pain and resilience. After its NYC debut, the show will travel to other U.S. cities.

"This show is not only about where we've been," says Tracey Nguyễn Mang, founder of Vietnamese Boat People. "It's about where we're going, and how our stories can light the path for others seeking hope and belonging. It's an invitation for all communities to reflect on the impact of displacement and the incredible strength it takes to rebuild."

"Think!Chinatown is so honored to host this meaningful exhibition," says Yin Kong, executive director of Think!Chinatown. "We believe in the power of sharing stories in intergenerational spaces. The stories Vietnamese Boat People bring to light are so important to hear."

Our Journeys is made possible with support from the Henry Luce Foundation, the New Jersey Council for the Humanities, the Asian Women Giving Circle, and many private donors. Curated by Tracey Nguyễn Mang and Sophia Ma, with exhibition design by Thinc Design and fabrication by Joshua Warner Studios, the show reflects VBP's ongoing commitment to amplifying marginalized voices and connecting generations through storytelling. The exhibition is free and open to the public from September 7–28, 2025.
